How should West play 3NT on a \&T lead?

## Solution:

West should duck the first round of $\boldsymbol{\AA}$ if South didn't cover the $\boldsymbol{\$} \mathrm{Q}$, to keep the spades safe before the nineth trick is developed. Later you can try if clubs split or the spade finesse. If South covers by the $\boldsymbol{\&} \mathrm{Q}$, then you should win by the $\boldsymbol{\%}$. You already have 2 hearts, 4 diamonds and 3 clubs.

How should West play 3NT on a 2 lead (most likely 4th from the suit)?

## Solution:

West should win the spades in his hand and play small diamonds from both hand to keep the connection (or do so after $\diamond \mathrm{K}$ is played first). If West failed to do so, you may only have 2 diamond tricks if the diamonds is 4-1 (Work this situation out by yourself!).
